Travelers who venture to northern Spain will discover alluring architecture, colorful street life, and next-level cuisine. In Barcelona, see how the architect Antoni Gaudí and the city are almost inseparable. Boasting nearly a dozen buildings designed by Gaudí, many of which are UNESCO World Heritage sites. The city itself is like a museum, so it's easy to soak in the creative spirit—all you have to do is walk around. Then, journey into Basque Country and explore the unique sites of Pamplona and Bilbao, from the Running of the Bulls route to the Frank Gehry-designed Guggenheim, you'll be sure to fall in love with this vibrant part of the country.

Overnight Flight → 1 night

Day 1: Travel day

Board your overnight flight to Barcelona today.

Barcelona → 4 nights

Day 2: Arrival in Barcelona

Included meals: welcome dinner
Welcome to Spain! Meet your Tour Director and fellow travelers at tonight's welcome dinner.

Day 3: Güell Palace & Colònia Güell

Included meals: breakfast

Head outside of Barcelona this morning and dive into some of Antoni Gaudi's earlier and lesser-known UNESCO-listed works.

- Visit Palau Güell, or Güell Palace, Gaudi's first major work in the Catalan capital, designed for the industrial tycoon Eusebi Güell during the late 1800s
- Embark on a guided tour of the palace and view Gaudí's unusual and bold architectural stylings which use a variety of materials
- Learn how each floor serves as a metaphor for Güell's life, from the plain basement representing his poor beginnings to an overthe-top roof symbolizing his rise to wealth
- Travel to the town of Santa Coloma de Cervelló where you'll explore Colònia Güell, another commissioned piece by Count Güell—Gaudí's main patron
- Hear the history of how Gaudí was asked to design a church for Güell's new industrial village with no budget or deadline
- View the crypt, which is arguably the best place to see Gaudi's whimsical engineering techniques in one spot

Return to Barcelona and enjoy free time for the rest of the day, or add an evening excursion.

Day 4: Park Güell & Mies van der Rohe Pavilion

Included meals: breakfast
Start off the day by heading to Park Güell, which was originally designed as a private neighborhood for the wealthy.

- Spend time walking through the park, which contains stunning buildings, intricate stonework, and colorful mosaics
- At the top of the park, marvel at the brilliant views of Barcelona

This afternoon, head to Pavelló Mies van der Rohe, or more simply the Barcelona Pavilion, designed by German architects Ludwig Mies van der Rohe and Lilly Reich for the Barcelona International Exhibit.

- View the different materials used in the pavilion from glass, steel, and a variety of marbles such as greens and Roman travertine which make this an iconic landmark of the Modern Movement
- See the beautiful Alba sculpture by Georg Kolbe, the shallow pool, and open spaces which all come together to complement the pavilion's perfect symmetry
- Learn how the space was deconstructed completely after the exhibition, and then reconstructed later in the 1980s to bring back the grand space to the city

Day 5: La Sagrada Família & La Pedrera

Included meals: breakfast
Spend the morning discovering the worldfamous and iconic works of Gaudí throughout
the city.

- Immerse yourself in the awe-inspiring beauty of La Sagrada Família, a testament to Antoni Gaudí's genius
- Marvel at the intricate details and stained glass that bathe the space in confetti-like bursts of color
- Take a guided tour of Casa Milà, popularly known as "La Pedrera," which was built by Gaudí between 1905 and 1910
- Admire the wave-like stone structure and grandly designed roof to the apartment, which reflects the style of the 20th-century bourgeois

The rest of the day is yours to explore the city at your leisure.

Day 6: Bilbao via Pamplona

Included meals: breakfast

Board a train and travel through the Aragon and Navarra regions to Pamplona, which is located in Basque Country, and get to know the old city on a walking tour

- Pass Plaza de Toros and walk along the Running of the Bulls route
- Admire Pamplona Cathedral and Pamplona City Hall

After, continue on to your hotel in Bilbao. Please note: Porterage is not included for the train transfers. Travelers must be comfortable lifting and carrying all luggage over steps, onto platforms, and into luggage storage.

Day 7: Sightseeing tour of Bilbao

Included meals: breakfast, farewell dinner
Set off on a guided sightseeing tour of the port
city of Bilbao with your Tour Director.

- Admire the architecture in Bilbao's Old Quarter, known as Casco Viejo
- Enter the Frank Gehry-designed Guggenheim Museum, a showplace of modern and contemporary art, and admire the unique architecture alongside a local guide

Gather together with your group to celebrate your trip during tonight's farewell dinner.

Included meals: breakfast (excluding early morning departures)

Transfer to the airport for your flight home.

guitar playing, singing, clapping, and dancing. A tapas
dinner will be served at a nearby restaurant before the
expressive, dramatic, colorful performance. Please note:
On some departures the flamenco show may take place
before the tapas dinner.
